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Position Description: In partnership with Strong Minds Strong Kids, Psychology Canada (SMSK), we are looking to hire a Postdoctoral Fellow to lead a meta-analysis or systematic review of research looking at mental health promotion programs with a focus on children and youth. The successful candidate will need to be able to create and execute the search, lead extraction (with a team of junior trainees and faculty), and conduct preliminary analyses by Fall 2024. The analysis will review mental health promotion programs or interventions for children and youth in general that can mitigate mental health issues or the need for services and interventions throughout one's lifespan. In addition, specific analyses on programs developed for traditionally marginalized socio-economic and cultural groups will be one area of focus. Other smaller research projects will be assigned based on the successful candidate's interest and future goals. Teaching (e.g., course directorship at York University) or clinical (e.g., Supervised Practice for the College of Psychologists of Ontario) opportunities could be integrated based on the candidate's preferences. Candidates will also support a national network of child and youth mental health experts both inside and outside of academia to build up their leadership, dissemination, and advocacy skills.

Qualifications:

- A Ph.D. in Psychology, Social Work, Nursing, Medicine, Rehabilitation Sciences, or a related field by start date of fellowship.
- Motivated to commit to a multi-year project is required (minimum 2 -year commitment)
- Strong publication record demonstrating leadership in peer-reviewed journals
- Leadership experience with systematic reviews and/or meta-analysis
- Interest in advocacy for equity and inclusion in mental health
- Ability to start as soon as possible (ideally on or before May 1st, 2024)
